**More information?**

### When is it open?

The Homework Club runs from 4.00 pm to 6.00 pm every Wednesday and Thursday afternoon of the school term.

### Where is it held?

At Casuarina Library on Wednesdays; and the Multicultural Council in Malak on Thursdays.

### How much does it cost?

The Homework Club is free for everyone.

### Who can attend?

The program is for young people attending middle school or high school from non-English speaking and refugee backgrounds.

### How do I get there?

You will need to arrange your own transport with friends or family. The number 12 bus arrives in Malak around 4.10 pm and departs at approximately 6.10 pm.



### What subjects can I get help with?

English, Maths, Science, Reading, and a range of other subjects as required.

### What if I don't have any homework?

If you don't have any homework or assignments we can provide you with Maths or English worksheets. You can also practice reading and pronunciation with a tutor.

### What do I need to do to join?

Young people (and their parents) can visit the Homework Club at anytime throughout the year. You will need to fill in an enrolment form, and this must be signed by your parents if you are under 18.

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The Homework Club was established in August 2008 to provide school and homework support to young people from refugee and non-English speaking backgrounds.

The Homework Club is coordinated by a project officer at the Multicultural Council (MCNT) and run by a team of volunteer tutors.

Tutors come from a diverse range of backgrounds and are able to provide support in a number of subject areas. Tutors work with students on a 1:2 ratio. Students are matched with a tutor who specializes in their subject area.

The Homework Club also has computer and internet facilities for students to use for assignments, and there is a small library for borrowing books.

A healthy afternoon tea is provided as part of the program.
