



2009 HARMONY CALENDAR POSTER COMPETITION - CALL FOR ENTRIES

Criteria and conditions for entry:

- The poster competition is open to Middle School students residing in the Northern Territory.
- There are three year level sections in the poster competition: Year 7, Year 8 and Year 9.
- The artworks entered for the poster competition must reflect the theme of the 60th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR).
- The artworks should express the spirit and Articles of the UDHR and may contain the messages "All human beings are born with equal and inalienable rights and fundamental freedoms" or "Dignity and justice for all of us".
- The artworks should not contain political or offensive messages or content.
- The artworks are required to be A3 in size and in landscape orientation. It is a condition of entry that artworks are not be creased or laminated upon arrival.
- All artistic materials are permissible, although the artworks need to be in a form that can be easily laminated and reproduced by scanning if required.
- Artworks can be collages that include text and imagery, although it should not contain material that infringes copyright or intellectual property.
- Each entry must be created by one person only, and there should be no identifying features or names on the artwork.
- The entry form should be attached (not stapled) to the back of the artwork.
- Individual entrants may submit more than one artwork into the competition (but only entry per individual would be published if selected).
- The winning entries will be selected by a panel of judges for their aesthetic and inspirational qualities. There will be 13 entries selected for publication: 1 overall winner for the calendar cover, and four from each of the three year level sections - Year 7, Year 8 and Year 9 - for the calendar months.
- The artworks should be post-marked by Friday 17th October, 2008 or delivered to reach the office of the Multicultural Council of the Northern Territory by this closing date.
- There will be an award presentation for the selected entries and a launch for the 2009 Harmony Calendar on Wednesday 10th December, 2008 (which is the UN's International Human Rights Day).
